The following paper was filed in the Supreme Court on the 7th inst., as taken from the Detroit Post and Tribune:

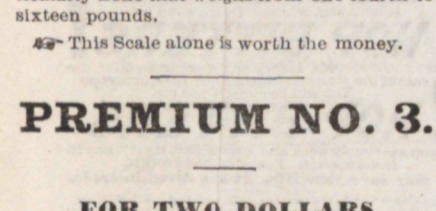

Scented Fluids in Use.
Some idea of the business of raising sweet scented flowers for their perfume alone may be gathered from the fact that Europe and British India alone consume about 150,000 gallons of perfume annually, and the English revenue from French de Cologne is forty thousand dollars annually, and the total revenue of England from other imported perfumes is estimated at \$200,000,000 each year. There is one great perfume distillery at Cannes, in France, which yields yearly about one hundred thousand pounds of acacia flowers, one hundred and forty thousand pounds of rose leaves, forty-two thousand pounds of jessamine blossoms, together with an immense quantity of other material used for perfume.
