We found it necessary to put railings in the opening in the court house halls for the protection of the children. We also had to buy a large amount of glass, for the glass in the court house is of a poor quality and many lights have been broken. We have replaced them with good plate glass and have sent to New York by Mr. Sorg and Mr. Hutzel, glass dealers, and, we think, got the glass cheap. We also found that the s. w. chimney in the jail needed rebuilding. We have made in it an eight inch flue; the old one was only four and easily filled up. A good many repairs were necessary, and all the bills will come before you for examination, according to the resolution adopted by the last board. Some other things need looking into, and reform in some things is very necessary, all of which is most respectfully submitted to your honorable Board. Signed, THOMAS YOUNG, COMRAD KRAPF, Wh.
