DOMESTIC.

The Indiana State Statistician reports 12,229 manufacturing institutions in the State, with a total invested capital of \$85,041,349.

ADAM FOREMAN, white elephant, the "Light of Asia," died at the headquarters of the great showman in Richmond, Va., a few days ago.

CHARLES NEVILLE was placed on trial at Toledo, O., on the 25th for marrying ten women without obtaining a divorce from any of them.

ABOUT TWENTY families living in the Bowery, New York, were driven to the roofs of their homes by the fire on Monday morning.

THE MORMONS were reported on the 25th to be once more at work in the Piedmont section of North Carolina.

AT LEWIS, Del., a skiff from the pilot-boat Turley, containing the pilot, Marshall Bertrand and two sailors, was wrecked a few days ago.

AT HUNTINGTON, Ore., on the afternoon of the 25th connection was made between the Oregon Railway and Navigation system and the Oregon Short Line.

THE NATIONAL CATTLE Growers' Association of America was incorporated recently by the Illinois Secretary of State.

THE LANCETER (Pa.) crematorium was dedicated on the 25th, and the body of a woman was reduced to ashes.

THE DISTANCE between the evacuation of New York by the British was celebrated on the 25th by hoisting the flag on the old fort in Central Park.

AT PHILADELPHIA a few days ago Solomon K. Grinly, who pleaded guilty to receiving greater compensation than allowed by law in procuring a pension, was sentenced to a year in the State Prison.

DURING A QUARTER at the Cananea copper camp recently, six men were killed and several others were injured.

THREE MILLS at Woonsocket, R. I. gave notice on the 25th of a reduction in wages, and three other mills in the same quarter time, beginning December 1st.

MRS. JOHN MULLIKEN, a wealthy resident of Boston, sold peanuts on the 25th at a booth on the common for twelve hours on an election bet, and realized \$100 for charity.

DURING A SEVERE storm the other night lightning struck the house of Joseph Shirley at Point Pleasant, W. Va., and instantly killed Mrs. Shirley and a daughter thirteen years old.

IN TROY, N. Y., Mrs. Harriet De Freest committed suicide a few days ago by saturating her garments with kerosene and then setting fire to them.

THE CHIEF of Bureau of Statistics in his annual report on the 25th stated that during the first four months of the present fiscal year the exports of merchandise were \$234,715,249; imports, \$208,813,693; excess of exports, \$25,901,556.

A BOY fourteen years of age was placed in jail on the 27th at St. Albans, Vt., for robbing the mails. He confessed his guilt.

PARIS had on the 27th resumed its usual appearance. It was estimated that the total number of deaths by the recent influx of cholera would reach 866.

SEVERAL violent shocks of earthquake were felt at Geneva, Switzerland, on the 28th.

THE bark Luke Bruce collided on the 28th with the steamer Domingo in the English Channel. The Domingo sank, and twenty persons were drowned.

ADVICES of the 28th from English officials in India stated that there was a dangerous condition of affairs in that country, as the feelings of the natives were never so excited against England as at present.

DYNAMITERS have recently been at work on the residence of Samuel Hussey, at a Dublin. Several windows and part of a wall were badly shattered, but no one was hurt.

LATER NEWS. THE Postmaster-General, in his annual report issued on the 25th, says that the expenditures of his department for the fiscal year were \$46,328,127.

THE official vote of Colorado at the recent election was as follows: Blaine, 39,277; Cleveland, 27,677; Butler, 1,937; St. John, 759.

E. WILLIS WILSON, Democratic Governor-elect of West Virginia, was notified on the 25th by Mr. McGregor, Prohibition candidate for Governor, that he would contest his election.

THREE hundred persons were on the 25th thrown out of employment by the temporary shut-down of the Home Sewing Machine Company's works at Bridgport, Conn.

THE annual report of United States Treasurer Wymann, issued on the 28th, shows that the net revenue of the Government for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1884, was less than that of 1883 by \$40,767,712.

THE United States and Canada there were 20,000 persons killed during the seven days ended on the 25th during the 28th previous seven days. The distribution was as follows: Middle States, 50; New England States, 25; Western, 87; Southern, 65; Pacific States and Territories, 22; Canada, 23.

PERSONAL AND POLITICAL. THE official canvass of the Electoral vote of Iowa was completed on the 25th, and gives Blaine 10, Cleveland (Fusion), 17,286; Butler's vote (as near as could be learned), 33,000; Blaine's majority over Cleveland, 52,803; Blaine's majority over Cleveland and Butler, 19,803; St. John's vote, 1,369.

JAMES L. PUGH (Dem.) has been re-elected United States Senator by the Alabama Legislature.

THE official report for Delegate to Congress from New Mexico was completed on the 25th, with the following result: Prince (Rep.), 9,509; Joseph (Dem.), 13, 271; Ryanson (Bolting Rep.), 5,192. The certificate was given to Joseph.

THE vote for Presidential Electors in Nebraska in its annual report on the 25th, Blaine received 76,777; Cleveland, 54,254; St. John, 2,508. There were a few scattering votes for Butler, though the Electoral ticket was nominally Fusion.

THE official vote of Maryland at the recent election gives Cleveland 96,932; Blaine, 86,692; St. John, 2,794; Butler, 531.

THE vote of New Jersey at the recent election is as follows: Cleveland, 127,784; Blaine, 123,432; St. John, 6,153; Butler, 3,494. The Republicans elected four and the Democrats three Congressmen.

THE canvass of the official vote of Kentucky at the recent election shows the following: Cleveland, 162,757; Blaine, 118,674; Butler, 1,653; St. John, 3,106. Democratic majority, 44,083.

THE official vote of Massachusetts at the recent election was as follows: Blaine, 146,724; Cleveland, 122,252; Butler, 24,382; St. John, 9,223.

THE official vote of Oregon is as follows: Blaine, 26,832; Cleveland, 24,583; Butler, 723; St. John, 488. Blaine's majority, 1,048.

THE official vote of the majority of Indiana shows: Cleveland, 244,894; Blaine, 238,447; Butler, 8,794; St. John, 3,077. Cleveland's majority, 6,447.
