Feeding out Corn Stalks. It is a subject to which we have given considerable attention...

But the feeding without waste—how shall it be done? Not in racks and mangers, at least for any of the half-dozen kinds we have tried...

When do cattle seem to consume corn with the greatest relish? Usually in freezing, cold weather. Then is the time to feed out corn-stalks.

If there is much manure in the yard, it will not freeze as early as on a dryer ground or more exposed situations. So we find in this year—a small lot back of the barn being froze hard while the sheltered yard is yet too soft for a feeding ground.

A neighbor of our's who raises four or five acres of corn, to our one, (and we hardly begin to do it), some years since tried cutting corn stalks before feeding.

He thought that it was some saving—rather more eaten than if left whole—but he found it a great deal of labor and the practice was discontinued.

Corn-stalks, we should say in conclusion, are always worth saving. Because one has a poor corn crop it is no reason they should allow half the value to be wasted.

Barking and Renovating Trees. The Gardener's (London) Chronicle says: "The system of stripping the bark off the trunks of trees, for the purpose of destroying the insects which infest them, has now been generally applied to a large number in the Champe Elysees, and elsewhere in Paris, and has led to the discovery of a curious but important fact.

It appears that trees may be deprived of the whole of their bark, not even without experiencing any injury, but even with considerable advantage, the operation increasing their power of vegetation. Elms, which, before the operation, did not increase more than one or two millimetres in diameter each year, have been found to increase four or five when stripped of their bark.

Are Your Cattle Healthy? The following hints, for the benefit of cattle and their owners, are worthy of attention. Especial heed to the hints about food and water will profit many farmers, who though not naturally inquisitive, often treat their stock most outrageously, either through carelessness or indifference.

Mix, occasionally, one part of salt with four, five or six parts of wood shavings, and give the mixture to different kinds of stock summer and winter. It promotes appetite, and tends to keep them in a healthy condition. It is said to be good against bots in horses, murrain in cattle and rot in sheep.

Guard against the wide and injurious extremes of satiating with excess and starving with want. Food should be of a suitable quality and proportion to the growth and fattening of animals to their production in young and milk, and to their labor and exercise.
