We lost about \$30,000 in army stores, clothing, provisions, etc.

Does the First district, with nearly 5000 more voters than in either of the other districts, propose to raise only a minimum regiment and do nothing for the 17th Infantry, 4th Cavalry, and the regiments now in the field? That will hardly keep your end up, Mr. Free Press.

The House on Tuesday, by a vote of 86 to 20, passed a bill abolishing Congressional mileage, making it applicable to the present session. This is beginning where reforms should begin—at home. We doubt whether the bill passes the Senate.

Another reform is needed. Members should not be paid a per diem for serving on investigating committees.—Committee men are certainly members and draw salaries as such.

Washington advises that President LINCOLN has not signed the Confiscation bill, and that he is preparing a veto message. It was probably sent in yesterday.

Hon. B. F. GRANGER is reported as the only Republican member of the House who voted against the Confiscation bill.

Just as we went to press we received a long letter from Maj. BARRY.—He had obtained the proper passes, and was to leave Washington on Monday evening to visit the Michigan regiments on James River.

We have not read the letter at the time of penning this item.

The rebel prisoners heretofore confined on Governor's Island, New York Bay, have been removed to Fort Delaware, and the buildings are to be or have been put in readiness for the accommodation of 5,000 sick and wounded Union soldiers.

Both Houses of Congress had agreed to adjourn on Wednesday, but on Tuesday the President sent in a message requesting that the session be prolonged at least one day. The House assented to the proposition, but the Senate adjourned without taking action on the request.

Congress has passed an act providing for the dismissal of all regimental bands, and the organization instead of brigade bands. It is estimated this change will save \$5,000,000 a year.

PROCLAMATION OF THE GOVERNOR.

Earnest Appeal for More Troops.

To the People of Michigan: The President has called for three hundred thousand additional troops to enable him speedily to crush the rebellion. Michigan has never faltered in her fidelity to the government, and she must not hesitate now in the hour of its sorest trial. It becomes my duty to appeal again to the patriotism of the people to respond promptly to the call.

It is the call of your country, through its lawful Chief Magistrate, made necessary by the events of a sanguinary war, waged to defend the existence of the government and the integrity of its territory. It comes to you emphasized by the blood of your brave fellow-citizens, wounded and dead in battle.

The present call is for six regiments of infantry, in addition to the recruiting for the regiments now in the field; and also in addition to the Seventeenth Infantry and Fourth Cavalry, now raising.

For the purpose of greater convenience in recruiting, and of making a more equal distribution of the volunteers to be raised, I have divided the State into six regional districts, corresponding in extent of territory with the six Congressional districts into which the State is divided by the act of March, 1861.

A regimental camp will be established in each of the districts as soon as it shall be required, for the subsistence, organization and instruction of the recruits, and a commander will be appointed for each.

Officers will be appointed to raise companies according to the practice heretofore used in this State, and such officers—one for each company—will be immediately commissioned and mustered into the service of the United States with the rank of Second Lieutenant and will be entitled to pay as such from the date of his muster, on condition, however, that he shall succeed in raising his company, otherwise he will forfeit both commission and pay.

The War Department has offered very liberal inducements for the people to enlist. Advances and bounties will be paid to recruits as follows: For each recruit in a new regiment, one month's pay (\$13), and a bounty of \$25, being \$38 in all, to be paid at the time of the mustering in of his company.

Each recruit in an old regiment the same pay and bounty will be paid. All persons, whether officers or otherwise, bringing recruits to a rendezvous, will receive therefor two dollars if for a new regiment, and three dollars if for an old one, to be paid at the time of mustering in of his company.

The State has made liberal provision for the relief of the families of soldiers, by requiring the Supervisors of the several townships to afford relief to such families, in case of necessity, to an amount not to exceed fifteen dollars per month.

I take this occasion, also to urge upon all soldiers now in the State, belonging to regiments in the field, the duty of immediately returning to their posts, if they are able to do so. The government now needs the services of all its soldiers.

Let us by one united and courageous effort bring into the field such an overwhelming force as will quickly put an end to the hopes of our unnatural enemies, bring victory to the Union arms, crush and destroy the last traitor, and secure permanent and beneficent peace to our distracted land.

What is Thought of the Proposed Canal Enlargement.

Some fifty years ago, it was agreed by treaty that the vast inland lakes, the possession of which, in case of war, would be of such decisive importance, should be practically neutralized.

Neither country was to keep any forces at all there. Equality of weakness was to be substituted for equality of strength and that understanding has been faithfully observed. It followed of course that in the event of a war, the advantage would lie with that power which could most rapidly collect or exterminate a naval force, and it was easily discernible that, at certain periods of the year, the change would be in our favor, and at others in favor of the Americans.

Had war for instance resulted from the affair of the Trent, in December last, the Federal States would probably had the advantage over us for a time. At that season, there was no access to the lakes from the sea and as the Americans were superior to the Canadians on the spot in population and resources, they could in all likelihood have put a superior force in the quarter by means of breaking up on ice and opened the navigation of the St. Lawrence, we could have poured a whole fleet of gunboats through that river into the lakes, whereas no such channel would have been open to the Americans. It was at the prospect thus disclosed that the Americans took alarm. Though peace was happily maintained, war, for some weeks, had been discussed as a probable contingency, and the advantage secured to us by the possession of the St. Lawrence was contemplated with great uneasiness.
