The Quota of the State 10,026. The quota of the State of Michigan under the pending call for troops, as re-assigned, is 10,026. This is distributed among the several Congressional Districts as follows:

From Cairo, Jan. 30. Fagan's and Parsons' brigades are stationed at Camden, Arkansas. They compose all the troops of Price's army that have returned to the place from where the Missouri expedition originally set out. Desertions are very frequent from their demoralized forces.
