HALL OF COUNTERFEITERS.

A nest of
counterfeiters, bogus makers, &c., has
been broken up at Manchester, by
the arrest of two denizens of that
town, Geo. CORWIN and THOS. HAY, and
confederate, L. L. DOAN of Norvell, Jack-
son county. CORWIN passed a counterfeit
bill at Chelsea, and being arrested and search-
ed more of the same kind was found in his
possession than it was thought an honest man
was entitled to. Prosecuting Attorney
BROOKER was sent for, and CORWIN dropping
marks that led to suspicion of the location
of headquarters, a raid was made by the offi-
cials on the saloon of HAY at Manchester,
which resulted in the discovery of several
hundred dollars of counterfeit bills, including
United States notes, State Bank issues, postal
currency, &c. Some of the bills were
eighty four cent stuff, but the 50 cent postal is
well executed and calculated to go lively.—
Now for the manufacture of bogus was also
used, with some coin, and metal ready for
use. The currency makers were brought
here on Wednesday and deposited in Win-
nipeg's Bank. We presume that they will be
turned over to the United States authorities.
The officers are on track of other parties.
