The following letter was written by Prof. M. C. Tyler to the recent convention held at Battle Creek:

DEAR MADAM: I regret that owing to an unusual pressure of work here, I am deprived of the privilege of attending the State Woman Suffrage Convention at Battle Creek to-morrow, and expressing my presence there on the 4th. I have in the righteousness of the principle which that convention is called upon to represent.

Since the opening of the 15th century, however, one very different idea has been beating at the heart of society, and pushing forward civilization in every direction towards something better than all this.

Personally, Mr. Prentice was rather a homely, commonplace looking man, when his features were in repose. But when he was interested, and talked freely, which was seldom, his face lighted up and his eyes redeemed its paleness.

It follows from this that no person can logically oppose Woman Suffrage without opposing likewise the development of modern society.

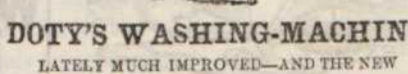
