Grasses for Dairy Cows.

At the recent meeting of the American Dairyman's Association, Richard Goodman, of Lenox, Massachusetts, read an essay on this subject. He believes that early cut grass is the best for milk cows and calves, but that oxen and horses need it a little more ripened, and it is far more profitable for the farmer to seed and draw two muck cartloads of manure to the land...

Mr. Goodman believes that a variety of grasses are better than one or two kinds, though generally timothy and clover are sown together in the spring, with one or two other except red top, which grows in the fall. It is eminently desirable that we should ascertain by the dry or experiment the geological formation of our soil, and when every farmer is made acquainted with the constituent properties of his land, we shall be able to have some certain rules, to regulate practice, and a more homogeneous system of farming throughout the country.
