State Aid in Michigan. There is now pending in Michigan an issue of extreme importance, the approval, to wit, or disapproval of State aid.

It is sincerely to be hoped that the people of Michigan will overwhelmingly defeat any such proposition. The argument for validation is that though there is no constitutional warrant for these bonds, still they have been issued and should be provided for as obligations entered into, illegally perhaps, but still in good faith.

But, says some one, it is really advised that nothing be done in the matter of these bonds? Nothing, certainly, in the form of legislative action or an amendment to the State constitution.

There is a lesson to be learned from the Michigan case, and that is, in Michigan, we urge it upon the people of Michigan to vote down any proposition favoring of this doctrine, and this benefit themselves, while at the same time averting ill from others.
