Shooting Affair. On Friday evening of last week a daring outrage, with serious and nearly fatal consequences, was perpetrated at Hangsterfer's saloon.

On the night of October 28, 1870, one Henry C. Johnson, Jr., shot at a citizen of Ann Arbor, Mich. Johnson is about 23 years old; 5 feet 8 inches in height; weight, 150 pounds; light complexion, blue eyes (watery appearance); brown hair; had light side whiskers; was dressed in dark and light pants, and alpaca cap.

Johnson fled into the country, stopped at a farm-house in Superior about 3 o'clock A. M., reporting himself thrown from a horse, stayed until morning, left about 6 o'clock, went to Ypsilanti, jumped on the 11 A. M. freight train after it left the station, and arrived at Detroit about 2 o'clock P. M.
