Cutting and Curing Pork. One of the most important economies in farm labor is the cutting and curing of pork...

After the hogs are thoroughly eared, which will require from twelve to thirty-six hours, according to the weight of the animals, they should be laid on the cutting block or platform, and the head taken off with a sharp, long-bladed knife...

All the trimmings are valuable, either for sausage or lard. Nothing need be lost, and all ragged portions of meat left on the cuttings are always lost in curing...

When divided for bacon, the sides should be divided once from the shoulder to the ham, and left in two pieces; but if for salting in the barrel, it must be divided into suitable pieces from the back to the flank.

The head is now all that is left. This should be laid upon its side and the knife passed around from the articulation or joint of the lower jaw to the joint in the neck bone, and cloven through with an axe or cleaver...

When cured, the hams, shoulders and bacon should be rubbed with good salt to draw out the blood, for which purpose they should be about forty-eight hours. Then rub them with a mixture of salt and molasses as hot as the hand can bear...

In barreling pork, salt should first be liberally laid on the bottom of the barrel, and the pieces laid carefully in, the skin next the barrel, and the meat closely packed so that the air will be as free as possible...

When cured, the hams, shoulders and bacon should be rubbed with hickory sawdust or chips, or some other sound wood, a longer or shorter time, according to the taste of the family. Above all, smoke slowly; do not let the fire get so hot as to make the drip...

During the winter months horses' legs often receive injuries from which they never recover; these injuries are most common in the country where the roads are not paved, and where the fall of snow is much greater than it is in the cities...

The greater part of these are rather the result of the harshness of the part of the owners and groomers than from any natural causes. The disease, if it may be called such, known as the "scratches" in this country and the "grease" in England, is almost prevalent, particularly among farm-horses; if driven through mud, rain and wet, and immediately after his harness is off, it is turned into the stable and allowed to stand without having his legs washed or dried...

Careful cleaning will prevent all difficulty, but the use of leather boots lessens the labor in this respect, besides protecting the horses' legs from injury by ice or the hard crust on the ground in snow. These boots can be made by any harness maker, and will, if properly constructed, prove a source of profit. They should be made of light, soft leather, and lined with soft felt or flannel; they must not extend up more than half way between the hock and the knee, but come well down over the top of the hoof. They require to be well fitted in order to keep them in their place...

In making up, allow the outer edge of the hoof to rest on a half inch, set on a well rounded edge; punch eyelet holes in the welt and the other edge of the boot. If these boots are well fitted they answer as a protection to the leg from injury by the ice, and also prevent it from being cut by the other foot. A little practice in making up will enable any manufacturer to produce them at a small cost.

A bill has passed both Houses of the Illinois Legislature which makes a radical change in regulating the sale of liquor in the State. It makes it unlawful to sell intoxicating liquor without a license, and no license shall be issued unless the party applying therefor shall give a bond in the amount of \$500. The two freehold estates contained in that bill shall pay all damages to any person, in person or property, by reason of selling liquor under said license, the penalty to be recovered in the courts of the State for the use of any person injured by the liquor sold by such licensee.
