The aggregate number of miles now in operation amounts to 3,200. Many of these roads will traverse the State in all directions.

The powers which they exercise in the construction and management of these roads are derived from legislative grant.

The continued control of the State over them is reserved by the Constitution, and is complete as to all, except specially chartered companies.

It is a duty of the Legislature to prescribe all more police regulations. The duties, obligations, and rights of railroad companies, in the conduct of their business as carriers of persons and property, should be made the subject of legislative enactments.

Our present railroad law is in many respects imperfect. It is impracticable here to enumerate in detail the existing defects; but many of them will be readily suggested, upon a careful examination of the subject.

I cannot, however, omit to call your attention to the necessity of some better and more stringent regulations in relation to the management of these roads. It is a duty of the Legislature to prescribe all more police regulations.
