AGRICULTURAL AND DOMESTIC.
Around the Farm.
The feeding of trees comes near the surface; therefore, plant no deeper than necessary to keep the tree in the soil. If there is danger of its blowing over, stake it, but don't plant deep.

The Rural World suggests a simple means of protecting young fruit trees against robbers, which is to place a few cornstubs along the stem with the lower ends tied near the ground, and the other end tied as high as the protection is needed. This application is found as good as paper, and more likely to be ready at hand for farm use.

TRANSPARENT young raspberries, when only six or seven inches high, and in full growth, in the early part of summer, is as safely performed as setting tomato plants, and they make a fine border to the garden. They are to be held the plants while digging about; take up with a fork, so as to save a large part of the cross root, and the roots well, and set out near evening or on a cloudy day. The muddled roots, packed in boxes, may be sent long distances by express.

Long winters are suffered in the dark under the best circumstances, and an animal upon which the sun scarcely shines at all for five or six months will come out in spring in a bad state of health, even though the feed, and the water, and the sun is the great life-giver.

KEEPING HOGS CLEAN.—The floor of a hog-pen should be of plank. The pen and hogs can then be kept clean. The animals are permitted to root up the floor, and the dirt is turned over. EGG CHICKENS.—The first eggs are always the best for hatching. CARE OF STRAW.—MATTING.—If white straw is washed twice during summer in salt water—a pint of salt to half a barrel of straw, salt water—and dried quickly with a salt cloth, it will be long before it will turn yellow. TO MAKE MUSTARD.—Mix the best Dutch mustard with water two table spoons to one of mustard, and one pint of water. Mix gradually until perfectly free from lumps, and add a little cream. TO UNDO THE CARBON CHAIR.—After removing the surplus bits of cane, cover the space with matting formed of three-inch wide canvas beveled woven together. Tack it temporarily in place. After placing over the matting a muslin, and with twine, making use of the perforations. Remove the tacks; turn the raw edge over toward the center and baste it down. Arrange the canvas in the center, and keep it in position by basting over it a piece of muslin. Then carefully tack the rep, pin it in different places until you are certain it is in perfect shape, and tack it permanently. The alone, if applied liberally, will keep the leaves from being eaten by insects.

AN ECCE TRIC FARM.—A singular family, named Kunkel, lives near Wernersville. It consists of four brothers and one sister. The oldest brother is 50, and the others are 45, 40, and 35. They are married, they being an anti-marrying set. They own the property on which they reside, a fine farm, but all their married sons have left home. A sister married some years ago, and they paid her share of the estate to her and disclaimed her, not having spoken to her since. Neither of the five has ever been out of the county. The farm has been handed down for more than 100 years, and was acquired by their ancestors over a century ago. Their house was erected more than 100 years ago, after the style of the first settlers—split logs for floor, filled up with clay.
