AGRICULTURAL AND DOMESTIC.

Around the Farm. Nearly all sick animals become so by improper feeding in the first place. Nine cases out of ten the digestion is wrong.

The importance of means of saving liquid manure is apparent from the fact that in every 100 pounds of cow's urine there are 65 pounds of water, 5 pounds of urea, 5 pounds of phosphate of lime, 12 pounds of saltpetre, 10 pounds of potash, and 10 pounds of carbonate of ammonia.

The carrot crop is rendered useless in many gardens by grubs eating into the roots. This takes place in many well-managed gardens.

A contemporary says: "Western cheese, like Western butter, is being made with such close care and attention as to command respect on its merits alone, and it is rapidly wiping out prejudices against the geographical position of the points of production."

Hand-picking the Potato Bug. I have about two acres of potatoes, and after trying many ways of destroying the bugs, hit on the following plan.

To prevent saddle-galls, the saddle should be lined with some smooth, hard substance, flannel or woolen cloth is best. A hard, finished, smooth rawhide lining, similar to those of the military saddles, is preferable.

I will suppose the gate, when shut, to hang on the west side of the post, opening southward; dig the post hole to three feet deep, fasten the east and west sides of the post (the part in the ground), then nail a short board, say 10x12 inches, on the east side even with the bottom of the post; now put in the post, placing it with its end in the hole, and according to the position of the gate, within sixteen inches of the post; then take a two-inch board, 16x24 inches, nail it on the west side of the upper edge even with the top of the ground, and dig the hole to the bottom of the post, and fill it with dirt well, and your post will not sag.

FOR CHAM CREAM.—One cup of cream, one cup of sugar, two cups of flour, two eggs, a teaspoonful of soda, flavor with lemon juice.

A SOFT HOME-MADE DISH-CLOTH.—A nice, soft dishcloth can be made of candlewick loosely knit or crocheted on large Afghan needles.

TO FLESH GOOD EGGS.—Put them in water; if the butts are not very fresh, wash them with a little soda to distinguish a good egg from a bad one.

GINSENG.—One-quarter pound of butter, one-quarter pound of lard, one-quarter pound of sugar, one pint of molasses, two table-spoonfuls ginger, one cup sour milk, one quart flour, two teaspoonfuls salt.

LARD.—The butter to be used for pastry should be as hard as possible. If left on the ice for a while before using the pastry will be lighter and better. It needs only to be cut through the flour with a chopping knife, not rubbed.

VARNISH FOR WHITE WOODS.—Dissolve three pounds of bleached shellac in one gallon of spirits of wine, strain through a cloth, and add one quart of spirits. If the shellac is pure and white, this will make a beautiful, clear covering for white wooden articles.

TAKE out the steels of a corset before washing; use one teaspoonful of borax dissolved in water, and scrub with a clean brush and a very little soap. Bleach in the sun if yellow, but do not boil. Rub in starch, and when dry sprinkle thoroughly and iron while damp.

EQUIVALENTS OF WEIGHT AND MEASURE.—This is one pound is one quart. Indian meal, one pound two ounces is one quart. Butter, when soft, one pound is one quart. White sugar powdered, one pound one ounce is one quart. Best brown sugar, one pound two ounces is one quart. Light-colored sixteen large table-spoonfuls are half a gill or one glass. Twenty-five drops are equal to one teaspoonful. A common tumbler to half a gill.

HERE is a recipe for a pudding, which may be made while preparing breakfast: Crumble four or five biscuits into three pints of new milk, add one cup of brown sugar, a pinch of salt, a spoonful of butter, and yolk of four eggs. Bake in a nutmeg tin, spread the whites of the four eggs beaten to a foam with three spoonfuls of sugar and a little essence of lemon on top of the pudding; set it in the oven till brown, which will be in two minutes.
